Our pioneering Mental Health Intensive Mentorship consists of a three-day course where mental health providers develop a sensory processing lens to view behaviors associated with presenting mental health concerns. Participants develop critical thinking pathways for Sensory Processing Disorder recognition and impact on clients' presenting problem areas. Participants leave with a toolbox of assessment strategies and resources to use in practice for evaluation, referral and education.

Benefits include:

- Enhanced foundational understanding of neurological contributors to associated presentations of ASD, ADHD, Anxiety Disorder across the lifespan
- Ability to identify issues associated with sensory processing disorder in various environments (home, school, community) and how they contribute clients' presenting problems across the lifespan
- Recognizing signs of when to refer, to who and what their treatment should look like.
- Developing a tool box of assessment tools and resources to use in practice for evaluation, referral, and education of clients, families, educators and other support team members.

Participant Requirements:

Licensed MH provider OR Registered Psychotherapist OR Holding a candidate permit OR holding a Provisional License in MH field

Individuals with Sensory Processing Disorder present with behavioral issues, anxiety, depression, school/work failure, and many other problems if not met with effective evaluation and treatment. Untreated SPD that persists into adulthood can affect an individual's ability to succeed in marriage, work, and community social environments. It is imperative that psychologists and other qualified mental health providers have the ability to consider sensory components in their practice and know when to refer a client for evaluation and treatment for sensory-related issues.
