The Research Mentorship program is intended to help participants learn to initiate sensory processing based studies that can be completed over the course of the following year. Receive in-depth training from Dr. Lucy Jane Miller, PhD, and Dr. Sarah Schoen, PhD, of the STAR Institute, and Dr. Stephen Camarata, PhD, from Vanderbilt University. Obtain support and further mentoring from STAR Institute during your quarterly phone meetings.

This program launches you into the field of research while increasing the world's understanding of Sensory Processing Disorder as a whole. This advanced learning opportunity focuses on single subject research designs for studying treatment effectiveness.

It is strongly recommended that attendees come in pairs from a single site, but it is possible to attend as an individual if the proper support in place (please contact STAR for specifics).

Program Objectives:

- Learn to initiate studies that can be completed over the course of the next year.
- Receive in-depth training from experienced, acknowledged experts in their fields.
- Obtain support and further mentoring from STAR during quarterly phone meetings.

Who should attend:

This mentored program is designed for therapists that have the means and interest in conducting their own treatment effectiveness study.

Successful completion of a Level 1 Intensive Mentorship program is preferred but not required.
